MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Summarized (sworn and recorded) testimony of [REDACTED] XVIII ABN Corps IG Office, Ft. Bragg, NC, obtained by at Ft. Bragg, NC, on 11 Aug 06, from 0904 to 1041 hours by [REDACTED] the investigating officer.

[REDACTED] (witness) was interviewed and the following are excerpts of his testimony from an inspector general investigation into activities at the XVIII ABC IG office. Some of the allegations and issues discussed during that interview are now the focus of an investigation directed by the Office of Special Counsel (OSC). The witness was informed at a later date that the IO has been directed to complete a separate investigation of the OSC allegations. The witness was informed the IO is not using IG procedures in this second investigation, nor is he acting in his IG capacity. The witness was also informed for the OSC investigation now being conducted, the IO is following AR 15-6 type procedures for records release. That means that the witness's identity, and his testimony, may be released for official uses only to various government agencies, to include the President himself. The witness was informed that this testimony may be released outside of official channels under normal FOIA and Privacy Act rules, but the witness's identity should remain protected. The witness had the option of reviewing, adopting and amending this prior IG testimony for purposes of the OSC investigation, or had the option of giving new testimony. The witness was informed of the authority for the inquiry, information required by the Privacy Act of 1974, and of the rights of a witness.

[REDACTED] testified that he had been in the Corps IG office since Jan 05. [REDACTED] testified that he wasn't very familiar with the [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] case, he said he reviewed it but can't remember what he thought about it at the time. He testified that he remembered when he first showed up in the office, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] mentioning that they had taken [REDACTED] down. [REDACTED] testified that both gentlemen frequently spoke in this context, and he mentioned that [REDACTED] said that this is what this office does, i.e. take people down. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] had called earlier in the year wanting to know why he was flagged because he was pending reassignment. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] looked into it and might have been because he had been under investigation, and that the flag should be lifted.

[REDACTED] testified he was not familiar with the [REDACTED] case. He did know that [REDACTED] was concerned about one of the subject's follow-on retirement issues.

[REDACTED] knew of no policy in the office of delaying, or any impropriety relating to the reporting of allegations against field grade officers to DAIG. [REDACTED] testified that he had an allegation against a [REDACTED] Jan 06, which [REDACTED] did not object or try to interfere with the reporting of the allegation to DAIG in a timely manner. [REDACTED] testified that he did not sense that [REDACTED] was covering are trying to protect any O-6s or Brigade Commanders at Ft. Bragg. [REDACTED] testified that senior leaders would probably be treated harsher by the IG because of the nature of their position.

[REDACTED] knew that [REDACTED] had made a second WB reprisal complaint. [REDACTED] had worked the first WB complaint she made in Sep 05. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] tried to give the case to him, however, in a meeting [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that is was [REDACTED] case and he was to work it. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] never gave any direction to close the case in that meeting and not to report it to DAIG. [REDACTED] did not know what happened with or the status of the case after the meeting.

[REDACTED] testified that he was not social friends with [REDACTED]. He testified that she is friends with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] testified that everyone in the office seemed neutral after [REDACTED] return from Iraq, but things changed after everyone heard that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were going to come back to the office after their initial suspension pending the investigation. [REDACTED] testified that he thought [REDACTED] was a neutral party in the office. [REDACTED] testified that most of the assistance IGs stayed neutral during the first [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] CPAC investigation, i.e. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] testified

that [REDACTED] had mentioned if [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] come back to the office they would work in inspections.

[REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] had mentioned in Nov-Dec 05 that he thought [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] should be separated in the office, and both were "useless as tits on a bull". [REDACTED] testified that he thought both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had manipulated [REDACTED] into believing that he would be blamed for everything that happened or failed to happen while [REDACTED] was the principal IG in the office. [REDACTED] testified that if [REDACTED] had a problem with [REDACTED] he would go to [REDACTED] about it. He testified that [REDACTED] would talk to [REDACTED] once a week while [REDACTED] was in Iraq. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] wanted [REDACTED] to give a [REDACTED] a reprimand, and that there were often closed door meetings between the three of them [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] testified that he didn't think [REDACTED] was controlling much of what was going on in the office while he was in Iraq. [REDACTED] thought that [REDACTED] didn't think it was his place to do anything about fixing problems in the office. He testified that he believed [REDACTED] lost control of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] as well as [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] would not right a wrong, and that she wouldn't get involved. He testified that often she did not come to work or came in late. He testified that [REDACTED] talked with [REDACTED] during his mid-tour leave. He testified that he thought [REDACTED] did not like [REDACTED] based upon her demeanor. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] didn't think [REDACTED] was very productive.

[REDACTED] (witness) was interviewed and informed that this was an investigation directed by the Office of Special Counsel (OSC). The witness was informed that the IO has been directed to complete an investigation of OSC disclosures. The witness was informed the IO is not using IG procedures in this investigation, nor is he acting in his IG capacity. The witness was also informed for the OSC investigation the IO is following AR 15-6 type procedures for records release. That means that the witness's identity, and his testimony, may be released for official uses only to various government agencies, to include the President himself. The witness was informed that this testimony may be released outside of official channels under normal FOIA and Privacy Act rules, but the witness's identity should remain protected. The witness was informed of the authority for the inquiry, information required by the Privacy Act of 1974, and of the rights of a witness.

[REDACTED] testified that he had received the [REDACTED] case probably from [REDACTED]. He remembered [REDACTED], being implicated in the case. He thought [REDACTED] had gone to [REDACTED] however, and asked to be moved. He thought [REDACTED] had granted her her request. When asked did he know if [REDACTED] was ever implicated in threatening [REDACTED] with reprisal, as was evident in her 23 Nov 04 testimony, by other IGs in the office, [REDACTED].

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SUBJECT: Summarized Testimony of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] testified that she seemed to have a completely different tone we had had interviewed her at a later date. He testified the issue of [REDACTED]reprising against her never came up in her interview, so he didn't pursue it during his WB investigation. [REDACTED] testified that it was never directed to him to not investigate [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had no knowledge of [REDACTED] directing [REDACTED] to coach and teach [REDACTED] on WB reprisal. [REDACTED] testified that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] did not see eye to eye. He testified that [REDACTED] was not welcome around the brigade. [REDACTED] thought [REDACTED] in the Corps IG office had initially talked to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] we she first came in to the IG office, and that she might have some more information on the case.
